



INFO PACK

Training course organized by **Histoire de Savoir(s)**, called “**Stand Up For Your Mobility**” between **the 18th to the 26th of March 2017** in Marchiennes, in North of France. It will gather **34** youth workers, volunteers, trainers, social actors from **10 European** countries during 9 days.

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Topic

Main topic of the content

The " Stand Up for Your Mobility " project is a European training intended for the youth workers, youth volunteers, and committed youth on the promotion of European mobility and cultural diversity in Europe. Concretely, it will be made of exchange of practices and ideas in order to build an innovative collective action and communication supports that will be disseminate in our local community.

The project will be held in Marchiennes and will gather 30 participants coming from 10 program countries. The participants whom the project will gather are all members of the youth partner organizations, interested to develop their competences and to multiply the effects of the project within their local communities. The target group is composed of youth workers, trainers, and motivated youth on the subject or project managers, all actively involved in the youth sector and having experience in mobility programs within Erasmus+.

The trainers of this course are experienced professionals, specialized in their field of photography, video and graphic design. The experience of all the stakeholders will be valued as a resource for the whole group in order to achieve transfer of competences and best practices sharing. This will be essential for the sustainability of the project, to develop further activities at a local level and between the involved countries. The course will be based on the specific learning needs of the participants. The team of trainers will create a learning and exchanging space, where participants are encouraged and coached to use their creativity and personal reflection to train, work with youth, design new workshops and achieve development of themselves at personal and professional levels. A pack of methods will be given to the participants at the end of the training so that they can use it at their return. Tools will be taught and, on the basis of their already existing projects in their sending organizations, participants will be also invited to share good practices, to exchange useful information, work intensively in order to improve their training skills with youths in regards to the subject of this training course and organize workshops in their respective countries. The project also aims at equipping participants with a sense of initiative and an active European citizenship feeling, to encourage involvement to be transferred later to the target groups with which the participants work on a daily basis, within their local communities in order to achieve multiplying effect. The local communities will benefit from the added value of this training and get involved in initiatives and actions on the topic which the participants will be better able to organize after their participation at this training.

Therefore, on a long term basis the project will create a European network to promote mobility and free movement. It will allow the partners organization to improve their skills in the frame of promoting their own Erasmus + actions and for the participants to emancipate themselves more and more as young Europeans, active and committed citizen for an intercultural and tolerant Europe.



Main Objectives:

Its objectives are:

- Share and exchange best practices to be innovative and start building a collective action for the promotion of mobility.
- To train the participants to techniques and practices of project management and the creation of communication support (photography, video and graphic design).
- To practice tools and methods for team building and collective work, project management, organization of cultural events, tools of communication, dissemination and follow up in order to plan actions back in their country
- To create a "toolkit" for the promotion of the mobility that will be directly usable towards the local community.
- To develop a common understanding between participants and organizations to support innovative project on the subject
- To discuss future means of distribution of knowledge to extend the impacts of the project at a local and regional level and promote it
- To create an European network that will share ideas and work together during following projects

Working methodology:

The program of the course will be based on non formal education and will be conducted using an interactive and participative approach. Active group/team work, outdoor activities, visual art workshops and plenary discussions, as well as theoretical inputs will characterize the program of the course in order to cover all aspects of the project themes. Special attention will be paid to the fact that the competences and the knowledge gained and transmitted during the course remain sustainable and transferable. This will be achieved by setting up enough space and time for reflection and evaluation, by providing comprehensive documentation, handouts and guidance from the trainers' team. A finished workshop pack of tools and activities will be given to the participants at the end of the training so that they can use it at the return in their own countries. The participants will then do a training course in their respective countries to teach to other youth workers training skills and tools on the subject. Then the youth workers who received this training can go to school and organize a day of workshop on free movement and European mobility.

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Histoire de Savoir(s) – Who are we?

Histoire de Savoirs is a French NGO working in the field of non-formal education thanks to artistic creation. Acting at the European level to promote active citizenship and intercultural exchanges, Histoire de Savoirs also organizes seminars, training courses, workshops in order to stimulate the exchange of knowledge, competences and experiences in social and cultural fields.

Legal description:

“Histoire de Savoirs’ main object is to supervise and to initiate citizens’ projects aiming to deal with societal issues thanks to artistic, visual and intercultural means. Using non-formal education methods, it acts for the transmission of knowledge and savoir-faire (know-how) by gathering on topics connected to contemporary cultures, young porter/carrier and professionals actors, for the collective creation of cultural events.

It action aims to develop critical mind of the participants and of the local community in order to bring them to be involved as active citizen for a better mutual understanding and social cohesion. It acts on the local, national and European level for the equal access to knowledge and culture, for the professional integration, for the promotion of tolerance and European awareness”.

How to get to Lille?

The meeting point to reach the accommodation place will be at the old train station of Lille, called **Gare Lille Flandres**. We will then, all together, **take a bus** to the training and accommodation place in the city of Marchiennes. For this reason it will be **VERY IMPORTANT TO BE ON TIME**.

The meeting point will be at LILLE EUROPE TRAIN STATION (boulevard de Leeds), in the front of CROWN PLAZA HOTEL at 17.30.

Be careful, there are two train stations, Lille Flandres and Lille Europe. Our meeting point is in the station LILLE FLANDRES.

Generally, you have 2 options **TO GET TO LILLE** :

✓ From **Brussels**:

- Regular plane arriving to Zaventem Airport: you have a train station just at the airport and direct train going to Lille.

✓ From **Paris** :

- Regular plane arriving to Charles De Gaulle airport: you have a train station just at the airport with train directly to Lille.

- Charter plane arriving to Paris-Beauvais airport: you have to take a bus to Paris and then to take the train from Paris city center (Gare du Nord) to Lille.

We also have an airport closed to Lille (Lesquin), you can check tickets to there, but it is quite small with only few destinations.

The best option and the cheapest is definitely through Brussels (regular or charter).

In case you would arrive earlier or would like to stay in Lille or somewhere else to visit, it is possible but please keep in mind that **ALL THE EXPENSES WILL BE AT YOUR OWN CHARGE**. However our team could help you to find accommodation or provide you other information if you wish!
